- Foundation Grant Fund Donations to this fund can be directed to a donor's specific field of interest or for grants in general. Students, teachers and educational service providers can apply for grants from this fund that will enhance individual, group or classroom learning. Also within this fund are two designated funds specifically supporting the following:
 - Literacy Grants available for RVCSD Pre-K student population.
 - STEM Grants available in areas of Science, Technology, Engineering & Math.
- <u>Classroom Grant Program Fund</u> This fund supports the Classroom Grant Program offering teachers the opportunity to apply for mini-grants to support innovative programs and/or the purchase of materials and supplies necessary for an optimal classroom learning environment not covered by the current school budget. It is funded by designated donations, the Staff Tribute Program and by volunteer payroll contributions from RVCSD employees. All funds collected will be available for classroom grants to the school designated by the donor.

Partnership funds:

Designated donations to these funds are accepted on an ongoing basis.

- <u>Alumni Choir</u> The Rondout Valley Alumni Chorus group is made up of former students in the music program who continue to have an appreciation of their experiences at Rondout. Music continues to be a part of their lives and as such they gather together to rehearse and present music to our community. In addition to giving their musical talents they also will be raising funds to support the continuation of our vibrant music program at Rondout and donate to other groups that support the children of the RVCSD.
- <u>Farm to School Fund</u> 100% of designated donations to this fund will be used to purchase food from Rondout Valley Growers for the RVCSD Food Service Program.
- <u>Field Hockey Booster Club Fund</u> This fund benefits the hockey program and the students involved.
- <u>Fireboat John J. Harvey Project Fund</u> This is a Service Learning project that concludes with a field trip to visit the fireboat as the culminating event of the John J. Harvey 9/11 Interactive Museum Project. The Museum Project involves teachers and students from schools throughout the district in a multi-disciplinary and multi-age exploration of the meaning of 9-11 through the creation of museum displays and interpretive projects.
- <u>Foreign Language Week Fund</u> The Foreign Language Week Fund was established in March of 2012 with an initial grant from Judith and Peter Hauser to support the activities that occur during Foreign Language Week.
- <u>French Class Trip</u> this fund supports an educational trip providing the opportunity for RV French students to be surrounded by the French language.
- <u>HS Advanced Graphics Fund</u> this fund benefits the HS Advanced Graphics Program and the students involved. Students and local businesses collaborate to design and print 3D logos through the 3D Printed Logo Filament Fundraiser.
- <u>HS Music Booster Fund</u> The Rondout Valley Music Boosters are a community organization that exists to support the music program at RVHS and the RVCSD. Membership includes parents, students, teachers, and members of the community who wish to help enhance the educational experience of the students in the music program.
- <u>Hudson Valley Stuttering Association</u> The HVSA is a support group for those who stutter in the Hudson Valley. It offers support and education for people who stutter, friends of those who stutter, and families, not only in the Rondout School District but anyone who needs support for Stuttering. The money raised for the HVSA would go directly towards making future activities possible, such as trips or booking local event halls to hold workshops, annual dinners, and meetings.
- MES Arts Fund The purpose of the MES Arts Fund is to support programming and enrichment in the Arts for all students. This fund was established by the MES Arts Committee of Marbletown Elementary School's PTA.
- Newcomers Uplifted Fund Newcomers uplifted is a freshmen orientation program designed to help new high school students become acclimated to the high school community. The goal is to build a safe positive and productive school community for all students. Select students in grades 10-12 are Peer Leaders who run peer groups and guide the freshmen throughout the first semester of their freshmen year.
- Rondout Valley Future Farmers of America The RV Chapter of the National FFA
 Organization makes a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their
 potential for premier leadership, personal growth and career success through
 agricultural education.
- Rondout Wrestling Fund This fund was established by a community member to support the RV program and the students involved in the program through the

- purchase of needed equipment, training materials and related event expenses as determined by the head coach/advisor of the program.
- <u>RVCSD Summer Arts Camp Fund</u> benefits student learning through classroom instruction during summer camp programs in the areas of STEM and art.
- <u>RVHS Gardeners</u> The purpose of this fund is to make the high school's greenhouse self-sufficient by hosting annual plant sales in which the students seed and care for transplants that are sold to the community. Each year will support the following year economically. While providing a local product to the community, students will learn how to grow and maintain vegetable, fruit, herb and flower crops while being exposed to the process of running a small business.
- RVHS Musical Theater Fund The vision for this fund, established by Judith and Peter Hauser, is to engage and support the diverse talents of the RVHS students, faculty and community members to produce an annual self-supporting musical in the high school.
- <u>RVHS Parent Association Fund</u> This fund was established to support and promote programs and activities that enhance critical thinking and problem solving, encourage student directed learning and foster collaborative teamwork so that out graduates are prepared with skills and inspired to be stewards and empathetic leaders in this community and beyond.
- RVHS Sports Marketing Field Trip Fund This fund supports events and trips for business students to learn from and experience business operations on a first hand basis.
- <u>Sandra Taub Golden Determination Award Fund</u> This fund was initiated by Bruce Golden, in honor of his mother's legacy of determination to recognize students, who regardless of ability and in the face of difficulties, have shown a determination to succeed in their educational endeavors. The Award is administered by the RVEF through the RVJH School Guidance Department and given on an annual basis to students on completion of their 8th grade year according to specific eligibility criteria.
- <u>Science Research Program Fund</u> The purpose of this fund is to provide financial support to students in the science research program for costs associated with their research projects. Students complete a grant application form to apply for needed funding.
- <u>Spanish Student Travel Fund</u> This fund was established to accept donations and collect fundraising proceeds to provide necessary per student funding to cover expenses, and provide for the establishment of a scholarship seat, for Spanish trips.
- <u>Sue Matson Distinguished Youth Award Fund</u> This fund supports a financial award for a distinguished youth community member as chosen by the Rochester Youth Commission.
